Homefull broke ground on our transformational 16-acre Healthy Living in West Dayton community development project. Construction continued throughout the year on Phase I, a nearly 50,000 square-foot, state-of-the-art facility to house a full-service Grocery Store, Regional Food Hub, Primary Health Care Center, Local Pharmacy, Homefull Headquarters, and more.

SPRINGFIELD

Homefull began operating a City of Springfield-owned emergency shelter for homeless families with children. Taking us back to our roots as a shelter and case management provider, with the support and partnership of many in Clark County, Homefull worked hard to create a culture of safety and responsibility and improve living conditions for high-risk families.

COLUMBUS

Homefull was honored with the Community Shelter Board's Nancy Jeffrey Advocate Award in recognition of tireless advocacy and significant impact toward ending chronic homelessness in Franklin County. We oversee the largest portfolio of permanent supportive housing in CSB's network, a majority of which are scattered-site units, providing the highest flexibility to formerly homeless individuals and families to live independently.



